Peter D. Bartholomew 1918 - 2006

Peter D. Bartholomew, retired Wayne County Assistant Prosecuting Attorney, passed away on Christmas Day after a long illness. He had been retired from the Prosecutor's office since 1978.

Mr. Bartholomew was known as a formidable trial lawyer during his 27 years as a prosecutor, while still commanding the respect, and often the friendship, of his attorney

adversaries. While vigorously representing the people of Wayne County, his basic humanity and good humor were evident in the courtroom.

Mr. Bartholomew was born in Detroit in 1918, the son of Italian immigrants, Domenico DiBartolomeo and Terenzia Monacelli DiBartolomeo. One of five children, Mr. Batholomew was the first of his family to attend college. He graduated from St. Bernard High School, attended college at the Detroit Institute of Technology, and received his law degree from the Detroit College of Law in 1943. He was engaged in the private practice of law in Detroit until he was appointed to the Prosecutor's office by Wayne County Prosecutor Gerald K. O'Brien in 1950.

Mr. Bartholomew was extremely active in community and political affairs and Italian-American organizations. He is a former president of the Italian-American Bar Association of Michigan, and served as Secretary of the Italian-American Chamber of Commerce, of which he was a long-time active member. He was a president of the American-Italian Association of Michigan. A member of the New Era Lodge of the Italian Sons and Daughters of America, he was instrumental in bringing that organization's National Convention to Detroit in 1960. He was a Chairman and active for many years in the Columbus Day Celebration Committee.

Mr. Bartholomew was predeceased by his wife of many years, Marilyn, and three sisters, Dorothy Giovan, Elsie Monacelli, and Donna Karapetian. He is survived by his wife, Antonia, his son, Daniel (Joanne) Bartholomew; a sister, Anna Furtak; three grandchildren, Debra Pesti, Danielle Keeler and Deanne Bartholomew; nine greatgrandchildren and four great-great grandchildren.


